#### Acts 10:1-11:18

### The Breaking Ground of the Holy Spirit

A frequent question to those in pastoral ministry is often phrased in this way, "How do I know God is at work in my life?" It really is not an inappropriate question. But I often reply with my own question, "How do you know God is not at work in your life?" My reply often creates awareness that, too often, we base our concept of "God at work" on feelings or emotions, rather than on the world around us. Too often we have "spiritualized" God entirely out of the world in which we live.

Today's passage causes us to consider how God actually works within our sphere of existence. The passage can be misconstrued if we only focus on the "miraculous events" and ignore the human activities in which God is at work.
